PE and Sport Premium Grant for Primary Schools

The government is continuing to provide additional funding for academic years 2015 to 2016 and 2016 to 2017 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Allocations for the academic year 2016/17 are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6, and those age 5 in Year R, as recorded on January 2016 Census, as follows:

- Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 plus £5 per eligible pupil;

The PE and Sport Grant for the 2016 to 2017 academic year is funded over two instalments

£2,495	To provide an afterschool dance club to enable pupils to display their skills to the wider community via shows and events	Several out of school dance events/competitions attended. Out of the 23 pupils who attended these events, 65% were VG pupils.
£1,260	To provide CPD to staff to improve the delivery of Dance, in order to ensure sustainable improvement in children's attainment	The CPD delivery has enabled staff to adapt their lessons to ensure pupil progress. The dance curriculum has changed due to the input from the dance specialist.
£4,864	To purchase specialist equipment to help support KS1/KS2 gymnastic classes within school.	The new equipment has been used in all gym lessons including KS2. The equipment has been used by the Gymnastics Instructor as part of an after school gym club. KS1 and 2 pupils have attended the gym. Out of the 20 pupils who attended regularly,

£1,225	To purchase two goalkeeping kits to enable to pupils to compete in regional fixtures	<p>The new equipment has enabled the school to enter several district, county and Midlands tournaments. Out of the 132 pupils who attended the club, 30% were VG pupils.</p>
